## QUICK knitted bells



Left: **Pomeranian**, 1 oz raw fiber spun 2-ply 11wpi, size 5 needles  
Center: **English Sheep dog**, 1 oz. raw fiber spun 2-ply 9wpi, size 8 needles  
Right: **Poodle & Angora blend**, 1 oz raw fiber spun 2-ply 12 wpi, size 8 needles.

**Materials:** Approximately 1 oz of raw fiber spun any thickness. Knitting needles sized to match your yarn. 1 Gold or silver jingle bell. Crochet hook (sized to match your yarn). Note: the thickness of your yarn and the size of your needles will determine the size of the bell. The two smaller bells shown above are approx. 3" tall, the larger bell is 4".

Cast on 14 sts.

Row 1 and all odd rows: Knit 10, purl 4

Row 2 and all even rows: Purl

Repeat above until there are 21 ridges. End on an even row. Bind off loosely, leaving a long tail. Stitch up side seam. Using a running stitch pick up the loops at the top of the bell and pull tight to close the bell top. With a crochet hook, chain double the length of the desired loop, slip stitch to top of bell. Thread remaining yarn through the center top and tie on a jingle bell.

Decorate as desired.
